Language of instruction

PUCP offers instruction in Spanish. The University requires students to be fluent in this language (good knowledge in reading, writing and speaking).

Degrees, credits and grading system

Bachelor degree: 5 years Master's degree 2 years Doctoral degree 2 years

The Pontificia Universidad Católica del Perú grades the academic performance of students using a system of grades from zero (0) to twenty (20), with eleven (11) being the minimum pass mark.

Each course has a value expressed in credits. One credit is equivalent to one hour of taught classes a week throughout the semester, or at least two hours a week of practical classes. Each semester has 17 weeks of classes.

Certificates

The Office of the Registrar (Oficina Central de Registro) at the Pontificia Universidad Católica del Perú issues certificates recording the grades obtained for each course. These will be handed over personally to the student or sent to the home university upon written request. The grades obtained by students of the School of Special Studies do not automatically count towards a degree or title awarded by the Pontificia

Universidad Católica del Perú. However, a student at the School of Special Studies who wishes to graduate at the University can do so by being granted regular admission by external transfer, according to the prevailing regulations. They will then be able to validate the grades obtained as a student of the School of Special Studies.
